Third, global inequality and digital divides will intensify demands for equitable contract terms. De León envisions a future where contract law increasingly incorporates principles of distributive justice—using standardized, accessible templates and digital literacy support to level the playing field. He also emphasizes the need for legal pluralism: recognizing customary, community-based, and indigenous contractual practices alongside formal systems, particularly in multicultural societies. This pluralism, he argues, strengthens legitimacy and inclusivity, countering the homogenizing pressures of globalization. Finally, De León warns against complacency. As contractual obligations grow more complex and embedded in everyday life—from ride-sharing to subscription services—the risk of legal alienation rises. He advocates for a “relational contract” paradigm, where obligations are not merely enforceable clauses but embedded in mutual understanding, supported by accessible education and participatory governance.
