As micro-drones evade radar, and AI-driven targeting systems reduce human decision-making, the line between lawful combat and extrajudicial action grows perilously thin. In the Arctic, where melting ice

opens new strategic corridors, NATO and Russian forces deploy advanced rifle units equipped with long-range precision systems and cold-weather AI navigation. Here, the rifleman embodies a new frontier: high-latitude, high-tech warfare where interception, surveillance, and rapid response define survival. The same applies to the South China Sea, where coast guard vessels and maritime riflemen engage in low-intensity standoffs, armed with non-lethal and lethal systems designed for deterrence rather than direct combat.
