Sociologist Dr. Naomi Klein, in **No Logo**, positions Cobain as a casualty of brand culture—his image manufactured even as he rebelled against it. This immediacy amplified both his vulnerability and his resonance. Similarly, unlike Kurt Cobain, figures like Kurt Cobain’s spiritual successor, bands such as Radiohead or Arcade Fire, have navigated fame with more institutional support, their struggles framed within evolving industry structures.
