Williams navigated this terrain with intellectual integrity, refusing to align uncritically with Soviet Marxism while critiquing the ideological complacency of Western bourgeoisie. His Marxism was deeply humanist—a commitment to emancipation not as abstract class war but as a lived project of expanding freedom, dignity, and agency. This nuanced stance positioned him as a bridge between continental Marxist theory and British cultural specificity, making him a pivotal figure in the global reception of Marxist cultural critique. Industry and institutional power shaped the

reception of Williams's ideas. At the University of Manchester, where he held a chair from 1961 until his retirement, he transformed literary studies into a site of critical engagement with social transformation. His lectures—memorable for their narrative richness and political urgency—drew students into the material realities of culture, from the lyrics of protest songs to the rituals of working-class festivals. Yet institutional academia, particularly in the 1960s and 1970s, often resisted such interdisciplinary, politically engaged scholarship. The rise of structuralism and later poststructuralism marginalized dialectical approaches, dismissing them as overly deterministic or ideologically suspect. Williams's insistence on the "organic" relationship between base and superstructure, his emphasis on lived experience, placed him at odds with emerging trends that prioritized language and sign systems over historical material conditions. Nonetheless, his influence seeped into global intellectual currents. In Latin America, his work resonated with liberation theologians and critical pedagogues like Paulo Freire, who saw in Williams a model for understanding culture as a battleground of meaning. In postcolonial contexts—from India to South Africa—his dialectical framework offered tools to analyze the hybrid formations of culture under colonialism and neocolonialism, where dominant narratives collided with subaltern voices. Even in Soviet bloc countries, where orthodox Marxism was enforced, dissident intellectuals quietly drew on Williams's emphasis on cultural autonomy and the creative agency of the people, finding in his work a language to articulate resistance without overt political confrontation. The controversies surrounding Williams's Marxism were not minor. Critics from both the left and right challenged his synthesis. Some Marxist purists accused him of diluting class analysis, allowing too much space for non-economic forms of culture. Others, on the culturalist side, saw his "whole culture" approach as risking relativism—failing to account for material inequality's structural grip. Williams responded with characteristic precision, refining his method to insist on the dialectical interplay: culture both shapes and is shaped by material conditions, but never reduces them. His later writings, such as
