In high-income nations with advanced diagnostics, exams increasingly emphasize molecular interpretation and AI-augmented decision-making. In contrast, LMICs often lack infrastructure for advanced testing, rendering parts of the FRCPath framework aspirational.

Organizations like the International Society for Haematopathology (ISHP) and the World Health Organization (WHO) advocate for adaptable haematology education models, promoting competency frameworks over rigid exams. Technological integration offers pathways. Virtual reality (VR) platforms now simulate high-resolution bone marrow slides, allowing candidates to manipulate digital samples in 3D. AI tutors provide real-time feedback on differential diagnoses, highlighting knowledge gaps. Yet, these tools must serve—not supplant—the human element. The pathologist's ability to weigh ambiguity, communicate uncertainty, and contextualize findings remains irreplaceable.

Controversies, Risks, and the Future of Diagnostic

Authority
