Born in 1978 in Lahore, he grew up amid the confluence of fertile fields and nascent industrialization—where canals once distributed glacial meltwater with precision, but by the 1990s, erratic flows signaled deeper shifts. His father, a senior engineer in the Provincial Irrigation Department, frequently spoke of the “debt” owed to the rivers: how every decision, from canal gates to dam releases, shaped lives and livelihoods. This early immersion in water's political ecology cultivated in Hussain a sensitivity to both technical detail and human consequence. He studied civil engineering at the University of Engineering and Technology Lahore, a curriculum that grounded him in hydrology, infrastructure design, and resource management. Yet it was his subsequent work at regional environmental NGOs—organizations navigating the fragmented regulatory landscape of Punjab and Sindh—that sharpened his investigative instincts. He witnessed how industrial effluents from textile mills, sugar mills, and cement factories drained into tributaries of the Indus, often unimpeded by enforcement. These experiences revealed a dissonance: while water was constitutionally protected, its guardianship was fragmented, politicized, and underfunded. His early reports, published in local dailies and environmental bulletins, focused on water quality in the Ravi and Chenab basins. Using water sample data and community interviews, he documented rising nitrate levels, heavy metals, and salinization—trends that correlated with expanding industrial zones and declining river flows. These pieces, though modest in reach,

established his reputation for blending scientific rigor with narrative depth. Unlike many contemporaries who emphasized alarmism, Hussain sought patterns: the slow erosion of a natural system under cumulative stress, not sudden catastrophe. This formative period coincided with Pakistan's nascent environmental governance reforms. The 1997 National Environmental Policy signaled intent, but implementation lagged. Hussain's work operated at the gap: between policy pronouncements and on-the-ground reality, between technical reports and public understanding. His field visits—boat rides through deltaic labyrinths, walks through salt-affected farmlands, conversations with farmers whose children now suffer chronic asthma—imbued his reporting with visceral authenticity. He rejected abstraction, insisting that environmental decline must be seen through the eyes of those most affected.

Geopolitical Shadows: Water, Power, and the Indus Basin

The Indus Basin, spanning Pakistan, India, Afghanistan, and China, is far more than a hydrological system—it is a geopolitical fault line. For Hussain, the basin's fragility is inseparable from the region's broader political tensions. Water in South Asia is not merely a resource; it is a strategic asset, a symbol of sovereignty, and a potential flashpoint. His reporting has consistently underscored how climate change and population growth are amplifying existing vulnerabilities, transforming water into a zero-sum game. He draws on historical context: the Indus Waters Treaty of 1960, brokered by the World Bank, divided river flows between India and Pakistan, yet never fully resolved underlying asymmetries. The treaty's technical framework—allocating the eastern rivers to India, western to Pakistan—has been tested by India's hydropower projects in Jammu and Kashmir, which Hussain has scrutinized for downstream impacts. His investigative work reveals a pattern: while Pakistan accuses India of "water theft," the deeper issue lies in Pakistan's own mismanagement—inefficient irrigation, leaky distribution networks, and a failure to modernize agriculture, which wastes nearly 50% of applied water. Hussain's analysis extends beyond bilateral relations to include transboundary dynamics. He highlights how upstream activities in Afghanistan and China—such as dam construction on the Kabul and Indus tributaries—threaten to alter flow regimes, potentially destabilizing Pakistan's already strained water security. Yet he avoids simplistic blame; instead, he exposes how regional actors exploit environmental uncertainty to assert influence. In a 2020 report, he detailed how Chinese-backed infrastructure projects in Balochistan, framed as development, risked ecological degradation and local displacement, with limited benefit to affected communities. His work also interrogates how global climate finance and energy transitions intersect with local politics. Pakistan's dependence on coal—driven by energy shortages and foreign investment—has accelerated under projects like the Thar Coal-to-Power plants. Hussain's investigations reveal a troubling nexus: coal financiers, often European or Gulf-based, prioritize short-term energy gains over long-term climate risks, while Pakistani state entities fail to enforce environmental safeguards. This creates a paradox: a nation committed to renewable energy goals yet expanding fossil fuel infrastructure under international pressure. His critical lens extends to regional climate diplomacy. While forums like the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) have called for cooperative water management, Hussain argues that trust deficits and national security concerns inhibit progress. He advocates for incremental, data-driven agreements—such as shared hydrological monitoring and early warning systems—that build confidence without demanding immediate sovereignty concessions.

Industry and Power: The Political Economy of Ecological Decline

Majid Hussain's reporting has consistently exposed the symbiotic relationship between state institutions, private capital, and environmental degradation. In Pakistan, the energy, mining, and irrigation sectors are dominated by

powerful conglomerates with deep political connections—entities that often operate with impunity, shielded by patronage and legal loopholes. His exposés on thermal power plants exemplify this dynamic. Starting in the early 2010s, he investigated the rapid expansion of coal-fired plants in Punjab and Sindh, revealing how these projects—framed as “energy security” solutions—were awarded through opaque tenders to politically connected firms. Using procurement records, satellite imagery of deforested sites, and interviews with affected communities, he documented severe air pollution, groundwater depletion, and toxic waste mismanagement. One landmark investigation linked a major plant in Multan to elevated levels of sulfur dioxide and particulate matter, correlating hospital admissions for respiratory disease with plant operations—data that forced Pakistan’s Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to initiate compliance audits. Similarly, his work on mining in Balochistan uncovered a parallel crisis. Large-scale open-pit operations, often backed by foreign investors and domestic elites, drained aquifers and released heavy metals into rivers. Hussain revealed how regulatory bodies, understaffed and underfunded, failed to enforce environmental impact assessments (EIAs), while local communities—displaced and poisoned—were denied recourse. His reporting prompted a rare parliamentary inquiry, though structural reforms remained elusive. Hussain’s methodology here is forensic. He combines public records, scientific data, and oral histories to reconstruct networks of influence: who benefits, who pays the environmental bill, and who is silenced. This approach aligns with political ecology’s core insight—that environmental harm is not neutral but shaped by power, inequality, and governance failures. His articles do not merely name wrongdoers; they map systems, showing how rent-seeking, corruption, and institutional capture perpetuate ecological collapse.
